WE REQUEST TALKING POINTS THAT CAN BE PASSED TO HURD FOR RECYCLING TO HAMMADI. END SUMMARY. .

3. DURING A MEETING WITH DCM OCTOBER 8. FCO MINISTER OF STATE DOUGLAS HURD PROVIDED READOUT ON HIS MEETING IN LONDON EARLIER IN THE WEEK WITH THE IRAQI FOREIGN MINISTER. ACCORDING TO HURD, THE KEY POINT TO EMERGE FROM THE SESSION WAS HAMMADI'S RESIDUAL SUSPICION THAT THE U. S. AND ISRAEL WERE CONNIVING WITH IRAN TO SHIP LARGE AMOUNTS OF AMERICAN WEAPONS TO TERRAN. HAMMADI TOLD HURD THAT SECRETARY HAIG HAD PROVIDED HIM WITH REASSURANCES THAT THIS WAS UNTRUE. NONETHELESS, HAMMAD! MADE IT CLEAR THAT HE STILL DID NOT UNDERSTAND U. S. POLICY IN THIS REGARD.

- 4. HURD REJOINED THAT IT WOULD BE INCONCEIVABLE FOR THE U. S. TO PARTICIPATE IN SUCH A SCHEME, GIVEN THE STRONG PUBLIC ATTITUDES ABOUT KHOMEINI IN AMERICA. HE REITERATED THAT THE U. S. HAS TAKEN NO DECISION TO SUPPORT THE IRANIAN REGIME. HURD CONTINUED THAT HE WOULD RAISE THE MATTER WITH THE USG AND GET BACK IN TOUCH WITH HAMMADI WITH THE RESULTS.
- 5. REGARDING FAHD'S EIGHT-POINT PEACE PROPOSAL, HAMMADI CLAIMED THAT THE SAUDI CROWN PRINCE COULD NOT HAVE PUT TOGETHER THIS PLAN ON HIS ØWN. HAMMADI SAID HE SUSPECTED THE U. S. HAD PUT FARD UP TO IT.
- 6. HAMMADI ALSO MENTIONED THAT IRAQ'S RELATIONS WITH THE U. S. HAD GENERALLY IMPROVED, AND CITED HIGHER-LEVEL ACCESS NOW ENJOYED BY USINT CHARGE EAGLETON AS AN EXAMPLE OF THE BETTER SITUATION.
- 7. ACTION REQUESTED: HURD IS WILLING TO WORK WITH US TO

DIMINISH TRAQE SUSPICIONS ABOUT AMERICAN ARMS SHIPMENTS TO IRAN. THEREFORE, WE RECOMMEND THAT THE DEPARTMENT SEND US TALKING POINTS CONTAINING APPROPRIATE REASSURANCES WHICH HURD CAN CONVEY TO HAMMADI, THEREBY HELPING TO SUSTAIN THE MOMENTUM OF IMPRØVING BILATERAL U. S.-IRAQI TIES. LOUIS

THE DEPARTMENT APPRECIATES FCO MINISTER OF STATE HURD'S SUPPORT IN HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH FM HAMMADI IN COUNTERING IRAQI ACCUSATIONS OF U.S. COMPLICITY IN ALLEGED TRANSFERS OF U.S. ARMS TO IRAN THROUGH ISRAEL. WE HAVE SOUGHT TO ALLAY IRAQI SUSPICIONS OF U.S. SUPPORT FOR REPORTED ISRAELI-IRANIAN ARMS DEALINGS ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS, MOST RECENTLY IN THE SECRETARY'S MEETING WITH HAMMAD! AT THE U.N.

- 3. IN RESPONDING TO HAMMADI, HURD MAY WISH TO MAKE THE FOLLOWING POINTS, WHICH ARE BASED ON OUR DIRECT EXCHANGES WITH THE IRAQIS:
- -- U.S. POLICY ON ARMS SALES AND TRANSFERS TO IRAQ AND IRAN IS GUIDED BY OUR STRICT "HANDS OFF" POLICY TOWARD THB

THE U.S. HAS, THEREFORE, NOT APPROVED THE SALE OR TRANSFER OF U.S. DEFENSE ARTICLES AND SERVICES TO EITHER COUNTRY DIRECTLY OR THROUGH THIRD PARTIES. THIS PROVISION ALSO APPLIES TO MILITARY EQUIPMENT MANUFACTURED ABROAD UNDER U.S. LICENSE.

- WE HAVE BEEN ASSURED REPEATEDLY BY ISRAELI LEADERS AT THE HIGHEST LEVEL THAT ARMS SUBJECT TO U.S. CONTROLS WOULD NOT BE PROVIDED IRAN. WE HAVE NO CONCRETE EVIDENCE TO BELIEVE THAT ISRAEL HAS VIOLATED ITS ASSURANCES.
- ANY EVIDENCE WHICH IRAQ CAN PROVIDE TO PROVE ITS ALLEGATIONS WILL BE CHECKED OUT THOROUGHLY. SINCE WHAT IS INVOLVED IS BOTH U.S. POLICY AND LAW, WE WILL TAKE APPROPRIATE ACTION NG WITH VIOLATIONS. THE IRAQI GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN SO INFORMED.

- 3. I ASKED WHY IRAQ WAS IGNORING EVIDENCE THAT SOVIET ARMS ARE REACHING IRAN. SAHHAF REPLIED THAT THE IRAQIS WERE "PUTTING HEAVY PRESSURE ON THE SOVIETS" IN THIS REGARD, BUT WERE MORE CONCERNED ABOUT AMERICAN ARMS WHICH WERE THE BASIS OF IRAN'S MILITARY STRENGTH.

- 2. FX-BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY LORD GEORGE BROWN WAS IN BAGHDAD DECEMBER 4-8 FOR A MEETING WITH PRESIDENT SADDAM HUSSEIN. WHEN HE WAS LAST HERE IN MAY HE URGED SADDAM TO UPGRADE US-IRAQI RELATIONS AND WAS TOLD THAT ! WOULD HENCEFORTH BE TREATED AS OTHER CHIEFS OF MISSION.
  THAT VISIT WAS NOT REPORTED IN THE IRAQI MEDIA. HOWEVER, THIS TIME HIS MEETINGS WITH SADDAM, FIRST DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER TAHA YASSIM RAMADHAN, MINISTER OF TRADE HASSAN ALI AND DEPUTY PRIME MINISTER TARIQ AZIZ WERE CARRIED ON TV AND IN THE PRESS. FURTHERMORE HE WAS PUT UP FIRST AT A LARGE GUEST HOUSE AND THEN AT A SMALLER VILLA RUN BY THE MUKHABARAT (SECURITY POLICE) WHICH SURPRISED AND ANNOYED HIM. HE AND AMBASSADOR EGERTON CAME TO THE RESIDENCE FOR DINNER DECEMBER 6 AND I SAW HIM AT THE BRITISH RESIDENCE AFTERNOON DECEMBER 8 SHORTLY BEFORE HIS DEPARTURE.
- 3. GEORGE BROWN SAID MUCH OF HIS TWO HOUR MEETING WITH THE PRESIDENT (WHO FOR THE FIRST TIME WAS ACCOMPANIED BY HIS HALF BROTHER, SECURITY POLICE-HEAD BARZAN) WAS DEVOTED TO THE U.S. OTHER IRAQI OFFICIALS FOLLOWED UP ON THE SAME THEME. HE ASKED SADDAM WHETHER HE COULD "SHARE THESE PARTS OF THE CONVERSATION WITH GENERAL HAIG AND SECRETARY WEINBURGER. " AFTER AN EXCHANGE BETWEEN SADDAM AND BARZAN IN ARABIC, SADDAM SAID HE COULD DO SO BUT SHOULD ATTRIBUTE REMARKS TO IRAQI OFFICIALS RATHER THAN HIM DIRECTLY.
- 4. SADDAM'S MESSAGE CENTERED ON THE COMPLAINT THAT THE UNITED STATES IS COLLABORATING WITH ISRAEL IN SENDING U.S. MILITARY SUPPLIES TO IRAN. HE ALSO COMPLAINED ABOUT IRANIAN ACCESS TO WESTERN ARMS THROUGH THE U.K. (THE STRONGEST DENUNCIATION WAS DIRECTED AT NORTH KOREA.) HIS ANALYSIS WAS THAT THE U.S. WANTS THE WAR TO CONTINUE SO THAT IRAQ WILL BE SO SEVERELY WEAKENED IT WILL NOT BE ABLE TO "DEFEND ARAB CAUSES" (I.E., WILL BE FORCED TO SUBSCRIBE TO U.S.-MIDDLE EAST PEACE PLANS). GEORGE BROWN

SAID HE ARGUED THE CASE BOTH FOR THE U.K. AND THE U.S. BUT DID NOT APPEAR TO MAKE MUCH HEADWAY WITH HIS HOSTS WHO SEEMED CONVINCED OF THE LOGIC OF THEIR ASSESSMENT AND THE ACCURACY OF THEIR INFORMATION. THEY DID NOT, HOWEVER, CITE SPECIFIC SHIPMENTS FROM ISRAEL TO IRAN.

5. ELSEWHERE IN THE CONVERSATION SADDAM REITERATED HIS DESIRE TO REDUCE HIS DEPENDENCE ON THE SOVIET UNION. HE ADMITTED, HOWEVER, THAT FOR THE TIME BEING HE HAD NO CHOICE BUT TO MAINTAIN THE EXISTING SUPPLY RELATIONSHIP WITH THE USSR. FURTHERMORE, HE SAID HE WAS NOW UNABLE OPENLY TO CRITICIZE THE USSR ON PERIPHERAL MATTERS SUCH AS AFGHANISTAN.

6. RE DEVELOPMENTS ON THE KHAFAJIYAH BATTLE FRONT FROM WHICH HE HAS JUST RETURNED, SADDAM CLAIMED THE IRAQIS HAD INFLICTED TEN TO ONE CASUALTIES ON THE IRANIANS. HE DID NOT, HOWEVER, CLAIM THEY HAD ACHIEVED A VICTORY OR RE-TAKEN THE TERRITORY INTO WHICH IRANIAN FORCES ADVANCED ON NOVEMBER 28. INSTEAD HE MADE A VIRTUE OF HIS DECISION NOT TO TRADE IRAQI BLOOD FOR IRANIAN TERRITORY. GEORGE BROWN'S READING WAS THAT IRAQ'S LEADERSHIP IS VERY DEPRESSED ABOUT THE WAR AND THEIR INABILITY TO EXTRICATE THEMSELVES FROM IT. AT ONE POINT HE REFERRED TO SADDAM'S BOAST DURING AN EARLIER VISIT THAT IRAQ WAS PREPARED FOR A TWO-YEAR WAR (WHICH THEN SEEMED UNBIKELY). THIS TIME SADDAM REPLIED, "YES, AND THE TWO YEARS ARE ALMOST UP."

7. AFTER THE ABOVE BRIEFING, WE EXCHANGED VIES RE THE PURPOSE OF SADDAM'S MESSAGE RE U.S. ARMS REACHING IRAN. OUR CONCLUSION WAS THAT THEY ARE ALSO SEEKING A SCRAPEGOAT FOR THEIR LACK OF SUCCESS ON THE BATTLE FIELD. THEY ARE NO DOUBT ALSO IRRITATED WITH THE SOVIETS WHO THEY BELIEVE BENEFIT FROM AN EXTENDED WAR AND A WEAKENING OF IRAQ AND IRAN. HOWEVER, WITH GEORGE BROWN'S VISIT THEY HAD AN "INFORMAL CHANNEL" FOR APPLYING PRESSURE OT CUT OFF A WESTERN RESUPPLY OF IRAN THROUGH THE BLACK MARKET AND ISRAEL.

8 COMMENT AND RECOMMENDATION: WE HAD ALMOST CONCLUDED THE IRAQIS HAD DROPPED THEIR CHARGES RE THE US-ISRAELI SUPPLY ROUTE TO IRAN WHEN ON DECEMBER 6, SAHHAF AT THEEOREIGN MINISTRY REITERATED IRAQI SUSPICIONS AND CITED 175 MM AMMUNITION. NOW WE HAVE THIS HEAVIER BLAST FROM THE TOP LEADERSHIP. GIVEN THE EFFORTS WE HAVE MADE TO REASSURE THE IRAQIS ON THIS POINT, WE WOULD BE JUSTIFIED IN IGNORING THIS LATEST COMPLAINT. HOWEVER, THERE SEEMS LITTLE TO LOSE AND PERHAPS SOMETHING TO GAIN BY UPDATING OUR POSITION, THIS TIME AT THE HIGHEST POSSIBLE LEVEL. HAMMADI WAS RELAXED AND NON-CONTENTIOUS EVEN WHEN EXPRSSSING CONCERN ABOUT U.S. MILITARY SUPPLIES REACHING IRAN. ALTHOUGH HE HAD OPPORTUNITIES TO COMPLAIN ABOUT RECENT U.S. POSITIONS RE THE ARAB-ISRAELI ISSUE HE DID NOT DO SO, THUS CONFIRMING THAT THE IRAQ/IRAN CONFLICT TAKES PRECEDENCE OVER EVERYTHING ELSE AT THE PRESENT TIME PRESENT TIME
- 3. I SHARED WITH HAMMADI SOME IMPRESSIONS FROM WASHINGTON CONSULTATIONS INCLUDING SATISFACTION WITH THE MODEST IMPROVEMENT IN US/IRAQI POLITICAL CONTACTS AND COMMERCIAL RELATIONS. I TOLD HIM THAT AS A STEP IN THE PROCESS OF UPGRADING OUR DIALOGUE, ASSISTANT SECRETARY VELIOTES WAS PREPARED TO VISIT BAGHDAD IN CONNECTION WITH A TRIP TO THE AREA WHICH MIGHT OCCUR IN EARLY MARCH. AS SOON AS WE HAD IRAQ'S AGREEMENT, WE WOULD PROVIDE SUGGESTED DATES. HAMMADI SAID HE WOULD REPLY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.
- 4. IN BRIEFING RE MY CONSULTATIONS, I REFERRED TO THE CONTINUED DESIRE OF THE USG TO DO WHAT IT COULD TO HELP BRING THE IRAQ/IRAN WAR TO AN END. NOTING THAT WE HAD NO LEVERAGE IN TEHRAN, AND LITTLE IN BAGHDAD FOR THAT MATTER, OUR EFFORTS WOULD HAVE TO INVOLVE SUPPORTING THE INITIATIVES OF OTHERS. WE HAD ALREADY MADE SOME PRELIMINARY CONTACTS, AND HAD KEPT IN TOUCH WITH THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL IN SUPPORT OF THE PALME MISSION.
- 5. HAMMADI SEEMED PLEASED WITH THIS INDICATION OF U.S.
  INTEREST IN ENDING THE WAR. HE SAID PALME WAS EXPECTED

6. AFTER MY REAFFIRMATION OF OUR INTENTION TO REMAIN NEUTRAL IN THE IRAQ/IRAN CONFLICT AND NOT SUPPLY EITHER SIDE WITH WEAPONS, HAMMADI REFERRED TO A RECENT REPORT THAT AN IRANIAN DELEGATION HAD BEEN IN WASHINGTON TO DISCUSS ARMS PURCHASES. I REPLIED THAT THE ONLY U.S. CONTACT WITH IRANIAN OFFICIALS I WAS AWARE OF INVOLVED CLAIMS AGAINST IRAN IN THE CONTEXT OF THE HOSTAGE RELEASE AGREEMENT AND THAT TO THE BEST OF MY KNOWLEDGE THERE HAD BEEN NO RECENT U.S./IRANIAN DISCUSSION OF ARMS. (WOULD APPRECIATE DEPARTMENT'S GUIDANCE ON WHAT WE CAN SAY IN THIS REGARD.)

7. HAMMADI SEEMED PARTIALLY SATISFIED BUT THEN
REFERRED TO CONTINUED ISRAELI SUPPLIES REACHING IRAN.
IN REPLY TO MY SUGGESTION THAT IRAQ WAS PERHAPS
EXAGGERATING THE IMPORTANCE OF ISRAEL AS A SOURCE
OF IRANIAN ARMS, HAMMADI CLAIMED THE AMOUNTS INVOLVED
WERE SIGNIFICANT. I TOLD HIM WE CONTINUED TO OPPOSE
THE TRANSFER OF FMS-CONTROLLED ITEMS TO IRAN BUT NOTED
THAT ISRAEL HAD OTHER ITEMS AVAILABLE THAT WERE NOT

THIS PROHIBITION ALSO APPLIES TO THE RELEASE OF ITEMS PREVIOUSLY PURCHASED BUT NOT DELIVERED. STOESSEL

- 1. WE VIEWED THE PROGRAM CITED IN THE "JERUSALEM POST" (REFTEL) AND TAPED IT. BBC PROGRAM "PANORAMA" LASTING 50 MINUTES TELECAST EVENING FEBRUARY 2. SEVERAL ISRAELIS WERE INTERVIEWED ON THE PROGRAM, INCLUDING DAVID KIMCHE, WHO DESCRIBED EARLIER ISRAELI SUPPORT FOR THE SHAH AND COMMENTED ABOUT THE ISLAMIC REPUBLIC. IN THE POST-SHAH CONTEXT, KIMCHE STATED THAT "WE THINK THE IRANIAN ARMY SHOULD BE STRONG," AND AGREED WITH A REMARK BY NIMRODI (IDENTIFIED AS A MOSSAD AGENT FORMERLY ASSIGNED TO TEHRAN UNDER MILITARY ATTACHE COVER) THAT A COUP BY THE IRANIAN ARMY WOULD BE A GOOD IDEA.
- 2. AFTER PROVIDING ALLEGEDLY FULL DETAILS OF ISRAELI SHIPMENTS OF ARMS TO THE IRANIAN MILITARY, "PANORAMA" INVESTIGATORS STRESSED THAT THERE WAS NO EVIDENCE OF U. S. SUPPORT FOR THE OPERATION. THE NARRATOR ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THE U. S. AND ISRAEL WERE SPLIT ON THE ISSUE OF RESUPPLY.
  3. "PANORAMA'S" CONCLUSION WAS THAT THE ISRAELI RESUPPLY EFFORT WAS STILL UNDERWAY (BY SEA) AND THAT ISRAEL CONTINUED TO TRY TO PENETRATE THE IRANIAN MILITARY.
- BECAUSE "PANORAMA" LEFT NO DOUBT THE U. S. AND ISRAEL WERE DIVIDED ON IRANIAN POLICY, THE PROGRAM COULD AFFECT POSITIVELY THE ATTITUDES OF THOSE WHO SUSPECT THAT THE U. S. HAS BEEN INVOLVED IN IRANIAN RESUPPLY EFFORTS.

1. PARIS REFTEL REPORTS THAT INFORMATION ON SOVIET ARMS SHIPMENTS TO IRAN IS HARD TO GET, EVEN THOUGH RUMORS ABOUND. QUAI D'ORSAY'S IRAN DESK OFFICER JUST BACK FROM TEHRAN REPORTS RUMORS OF RESUMED ARMED DELIVERIES UNDER A 1971 RPT 1971 AGREEMENT MADE WITH THE SHAH'S REGIME. THIS CONTRASTS SHARPLY WITH STATEMENT MADE BY QUAI'S MIDDLE EAST DIRECTOR BOIDEVAIX IN HIS JANUARY 21-22 CONSULTATIONS HERE WHEN HE SPOKE OF MASSIVE SOVIET SUPPLIES IN THE CONTEXT OF 1979 RPT 1979 FRAMEWORK OF AGREEMENTS WORTH ABOUT DOL 4 BILLION (STATE REFTEL). 1979 FRAMEWORK (STATE REFTEL).

2. WE SUSPECT BOIDEVALX MISSPOKE AND MEANT TO REFER TO SOVIET SUPPLIES TO IRAQ, WHERE MAGNITUDE OF PAST AGREEMENTS IS CLOSER TO SUCH FIGURES (E. G., 1976 AGREEMENT OF APPROXIMATELY DOL 4 BILLION AND 1979 AGREEMENT OF APPROXIMATELY DOL 2 BILLION). WE ALSO WONDER IF CURRENT IRANIAN REQUIREMENTS SUFFICIENTLY PARALLEL THOSE A DECADE AGO TO FIT 1971 AGREEMENT. SINCE INFORMATION IN THIS AREA REMAINS HARD TO COME BY, WE WOULD APPRECIATE EMBASSY SEEKING FURTHER

CLARIFICATION FROM QUAI D'ORSAY. BOIDEVAIX RESPONDED AFFIRMATIVELY TO REQUEST FROM DAS CONSTABLE DURING TALKS THAT FRENCH KEEP DEPARTMENT AND/OR EMBASSY CURRENT ON INFORMATION THEY RECEIVED THIS SUBJECT.
